And there is reserved from the lands hereby granted, a right of way thereon for ditches or canals constructed by the authority of the United States.

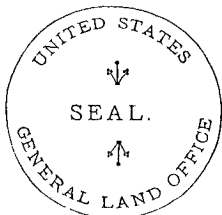
